2021 Statistics (SB County)

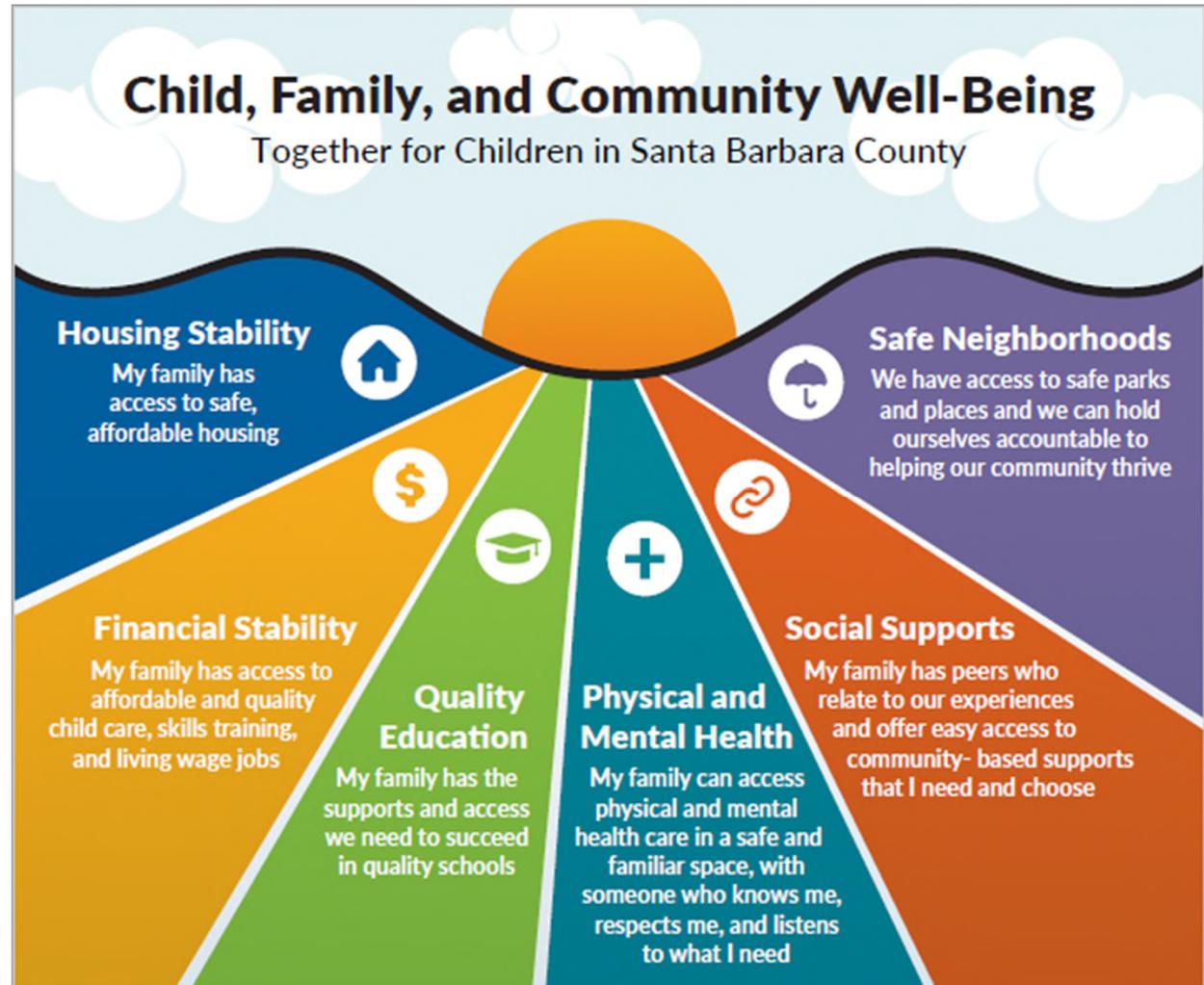
- 5,695 abuse reports
- 457 verified survivors and 3 fatalities from child maltreatment
- Cumulative lifetime financial impact = \$184 million

What if we could:

- Be proactive, not reactive: *prevent* abuse and entries into foster care
- *Reinvest* that funding into education, setting children up for success
- \$184 million could send 15,500 children to preschool

Making Prevention the New Norm



Focus on Well-Being and Community Support



- Only 8% of reports to SB County CWS were substantiated in 2021
- The majority of reports are consistently related to neglect
- Child and family well-being demands a different approach
- Separate willful neglect from symptoms of poverty
- Recognize the need for support and promote family strengthening

What causes family stress?

Being a parent/caregiver can be stressful

- Managing schedules
- Disrupted routines
- Lack of resources
- Trying to balance needs of all family members
- Isolation
- No time or energy socializing or self-care
- Feeling overwhelmed by responsibilities
- Judging yourself or feeling judged by others



How can a supportive community help?



- Understanding and compassion
- Social connections
- Sense of belonging
- Access to information and resources
- Trusted sources of support
- Wellness skills
- Opportunities to learn, grow, give back

How support can address parent/ caregiver risk factors

RISK FACTOR	COMMUNITY SUPPORT
Limited parenting skills	Parenting classes & home visitation
History of maltreatment	ACEs screening & education
Lack of healthy coping skills	Education & support
Substance abuse	Treatment & 12-step programs
Postpartum depression	Home visitation & mental health support
Mental illness	Therapy & mental health services
Teen parenthood	Teen parenting programs
Incarceration	Re-entry programs
Limited social support	Parent Cafes, faith-based support
Domestic violence	Shelters, counseling & support
Household challenges	Buffering supports for children

How support can address child risk factors

RISK FACTOR	COMMUNITY SUPPORT
Premature birth	<ul style="list-style-type: none">• Well-child visits with pediatrician• Online support groups
Developmental delays	<ul style="list-style-type: none">• Tri-Counties Regional Center• Organizations that support parents of children with disabilities
Physical disabilities	<ul style="list-style-type: none">• Tri-Counties Regional Center• Organizations that support parents of children with disabilities
Difficult temperament	<ul style="list-style-type: none">• Home visitation• Parent/child interaction therapy
Sensory/regulatory difficulties	<ul style="list-style-type: none">• Developmental screening• Quality preschool
Child younger than 4 years old	<ul style="list-style-type: none">• Quality, affordable childcare/ preschool• Parenting classes focused on early childhood
Adolescent	<ul style="list-style-type: none">• Parenting classes focused on adolescence• Youth-centered programs

Family Risk Factors...

What might families need?



- Homelessness or housing instability
- Single-parent household
- Social isolation
- Large number of dependent children
- Persistent stressors – financial, legal, health, food insecurity
- Family disorganization, dissolution or violence
- Poor parent-child relationships or negative interactions
- Immigration status and fear of deportation
